## **2006 Baltimore City College Hall of Fame Induction**

The Hall of Fame Induction Assembly sponsored by the Alumni Association was held on October 27, 2006. Albert Robinson is the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, which chooses the inductees and conducts the induction ceremony. It is difficult to imagine a college or university, much less a public, private or parochial high school, in the United States of America with a more prestigious Hall of Fame. Their installation increases the Hall's membership to 204. Introducing the inductees:

### **Neil Robert Bernstein, BCC '54**

Mr. Bernstein has established a proud record of over 25 years of constant service to City College and its students, faculty, and alumni. Mr. Bernstein, rarely at a loss for words, was one of the most vocal of those participating in the Save City College Campaign that maintained City as a humanities-based, college preparatory school. Mr. Bernstein also was involved in the rebirth of the Baltimore City College Alumni Association in 1978 and served as both on and as president of the Trustees of Baltimore City College Scholarship Funds, Inc. and the Baltimore City College board of Visitors. Most recently, Mr. Bernstein conceived the Castle 75 Thousand Campaign and endowed a scholarship in memory of his late mother and cousin. A long-time presence in the advertising, promotions, and college/university staffing area, Mr. Bernstein now concentrates on supplemental retirement plans and remains outspoken in his efforts to have City returned to the college preparatory A and B Course curriculum.

### **William M."Bill" Dunbar, BCC '49**

Mr. Dunbar has served City's students, faculty, and alumni with dignity for well over a quarter of a century. Mr. Dunbar was also in at the start for the "Save City College Campaign" and the 1978 reorganization of the Baltimore City College Alumni Association. For several years, Mr. Dunbar served on both the BCC Board of Visitors and Trustees of the Scholarship Funds, Inc. During his tenure as president of the latter body, the assets of the scholarship account nearly tripled. A generous regular contributor to the BCCAA Annual Fund, Mr. Dunbar also provided the funds to purchase and install a plaque in The Castle that honors the memory of BCC's three recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor. Now enjoying retirement, Mr. Dunbar served as vice president and chief lobbyist for a major telecommunications provider.

**Solomon Wolf Golomb, Ph.D. BCC'49**

An internationally known mathematician has been at the forefront of technology used in communications and space exploration for half a century. During that period, Dr. Golomb was on staff at Caltech Jet Propulsion Laboratories and then an incumbent faculty member and researcher at the University of Southern California for more than forty years. A member of both the national Academy of Sciences and the National Academy of engineering, Dr. Golomb's work led to the first contact via radar signals with the planet Venus. The inventor of and leading expert on the popular puzzle game known as 'polyominoes'" Dr. Golomb has also been recognized as a Johns Hopkins University Distinguished Alumnus and creator of "Golomb's Gambits" a popular feature in the Johns Hopkins Magazine.

**Leonard D. Ham, BCC'67**

Mr. Hamm commuted by bus from his home in Cherry Hill to attend City where he was a scholar/athlete and was installed in the Baltimore City College Athletic Hall of Fame for his prowess on the basketball court. Commissioner Hamm got his college degree from Philadelphia Textiles and Sciences where his team won the NCAA Division II basketball title and he was named an academic All-American. In law enforcement for over thirty years, Commissioner Hamm retired as a member of the command staff of the Baltimore City Police Department and over an eight year period took several related positions with other employers - Chief of Security for Baltimore's Downtown Partnership, Chief of Police for the Baltimore City Public Schools, and Chief of Police at Morgan State University. After being asked to return to the Baltimore City Police department, Commissioner Hamm served as Deputy Commissioner before being named as Commissioner in 2005.

**Aaron E. Miller, M.D., BCC'60**

Dr. Miller has distinguished himself for over thirty years in a career in internal medicine with a specialty in neurology. A pioneer in the treatment of those suffering with multiple sclerosis, Dr. Miller is renowned as a clinical researcher seeking a cure for the progressive condition that affects the speech and motor skills of its victims- most of them young adults. As a fellow with the American Academy of Neurology, Dr. Miller was the first chairman of the group's MS section. Presently, Dr. Miller serves as Director of both the Division of Neurology and the Multiple Sclerosis Care Center at Maimonides Medical center located in Brooklyn, NY.

**Bennard Bloch Perlman, BCC'45**

Mr. Perlman, whose art education started at Baltimore City College, has been a presence in Baltimore's art, culture, and education scene for more than sixty years. Mr. Perlman's credits include artist, art critic, writer, author, lecturer, professor, and citizen. Retired as the long-time chairman of the art department at Baltimore junior college/Baltimore City Community College, Mr. Perlman also was an art critic in the print and video media. The author of eight books of American Art Mr. Perlman also wrote many magazine and newspaper articles on the subject. He found time to serve as guest curator at Whitney Museum of American Art and sat on many public boards, commissions, and committees. A popular Baltimore artist, Bennard Perlman's works are on exhibit publicly – Liberty of congress, Baltimore Museum of Art, Peale Museum, etc.-as well as part of many private collections

**Mary R. Dudley Scholarship to Morgan State University.** Established in 1972 by a bequest from the estate of Mary R. Dudley. Awarded to Black graduates who have demonstrated academic achievements, good moral character and financial need.

**Joseph Meyerhoff Memorial Scholarship.** Initiated in 1984 by Joseph Meyerhoff, Class of 1916, and funded by the Joseph Meyerhoff Fund and Memorial Trust. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional combination of academic achievement, service to school and service to community.

**Benjamin Zimmerman**

**Royce Diener Fund.** Established in 1984 by a gift from Royce Diener, Class of 1935. Provides annual support for the Baltimore City College co-curricular program at the discretion of the Principal.

**John C. Wentz, Jr. Memorial Prize Scholarship.** Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Foreign or Classical Languages in memory of John C. Wentz, Jr. who taught Greek, Latin, and German at Baltimore City College from 1857 to 1862. In 1866, Wentz was elected the first president of the Alumni Association.

**Henry C. Wentz Memorial Prize Scholarship.** Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Biology in memory of Henry C. Wentz who taught Natural Sciences at Baltimore City College from 1882 to 1866.

*Benjamin Koshland*

**Sylvan Shane Scholarship.** Established in 1987 by Sylvan Shane, Class of 1936. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional achievement in Journalism as demonstrated by his or her contribution to a student publication at the Baltimore City College.

*Nazirah Muhammad*

**Alfred H. Moses Scholarship.** Established in 1988 by Alfred H. Moses, Class of 1947. Awarded to the graduating senior who holds the greatest promise of contributing to the general community through dedication and service and who requires financial assistance to matriculate to an institution of higher education.

**Hyman "Lefty" Stern Athletic Achievement Scholarship.** Established in 1988 by family of Hyman Stern, Class of 1926. Mr. Stern was the first inductee into the Baltimore City College Hall of Fame for athletic achievement. Awarded to the graduating senior selected as the outstanding athlete at Baltimore City College because he or she has lettered in at least one varsity sport and demonstrated team leadership and team play, determination, integrity and modesty and the potential for academic achievement at an institution of higher learning.

**Dr. Edgar F. and Phoebe R. Berman Scholarship.** Established in 1989, in memory of Edgar Berman, M.D., Class of 1932, by Phoebe Berman, his wife. Commemoration revised by the Trustees in 1999 to include the name of Mrs. Berman. Awarded to the graduating senior who most exhibits a sprit of intellectual inquiry, demonstrates sincere caring for his or her fellow human beings and is in need of financial assistance.

**Corbin Gwaltney Scholarship Prize for the Class Valedictorian.** Provided by Corbin Gwaltney, Class of 1939, for the Class of 1986 through the Class of 1989 and subsequently endowed in perpetuity by him in 1990. Awarded to recognize academic achievement and promise.

**Andre S. Wickham Memorial Scholarship.** Established in 1993 by the friends of Andre S. Wickman, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in the study of Latin at Baltimore City College in memory of Mr. Wickham who served in the Foreign Language department at his alma mater as well at other City of Baltimore high schools.

**S. Peter Lebowitz Scholarship.** Established in 1944 by S. Peter Lebowitz, Class of 1948. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant achievement in the practicum program at the Baltimore City College.

**Dr. Ephraim T. Lisansky Memorial Scholarship.** Established in 1944 in memory of Ephraim T. Lisansky M.D., Class of 1930, by Sylvia T. Lisansky, his wife and her family. Awarded to the graduating senior who between the freshman and senior year has made the most significant improvement in academic performance.

**Hyman Cohen Memorial Scholarship.** Established in 1944 in memory of Hyman Cohen, Class of 1932, by Jo-Ann D. Cohen and Howard L. Cohen, his daughter and son. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant academic achievement in his or her four years at Baltimore City College who intends to pursue a higher education program in Elementary Education.

**Alan B. Snyder and Susan R. Katz-Snyder Scholarship.** Established in 1997 by a gift from Alan B. Snyder, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who shows the greatest promise of contributing to the overall community through dedication and service.

**Robert E. Seney Excellence in English Scholarship.** Established in 1999 by his brother, John M. Seney Jr., Class of 1942, to honor the memory of Robert E. Seney, a 1944 graduate and later teacher at Baltimore City College. Awarded annually to the student who attains at least a 90 senior year grade point average, and who exhibits a high degree of development and use of the English language in all its forms, both written and oral.

Steadman, Class of 1945: the highest integrity and ethical standards, and a commitment to helping one's fellow man.

Awarded to the best member of the graduating senior class who has demonstrated superior academic ability, extraordinary service to the school and potential for significant achievement in an institution of higher learning.

**The Campbell Bernstein Slusky Scholarship.** Established in 2005 by Neil R. Berstein, Class of 1954, in memory of Irene Campbell Bernstein, his mother, and Stanton H. Slusky, his cousin, Class of 1950. Awarded to the most diversely talented graduating senior who has achieved an academic rank in the top twenty percent of his or her class and earned a varsity athletic letter and participated for at least two years in a Baltimore City College instrumental or vocal music group.

**Calvin E. Tyler, Jr. Scholarship.** Established in 2005 by Calvin E. Tyler, Jr., Baltimore City College Class of 1960. Awarded annually to a graduating senior who is a resident of Baltimore and is deserving of financial assistance to attend an institution of higher learning.

**Magdalena Nowasadko**

**Dr. Stanley Kogan Scholarship.** In recognition of a graduating student exhibiting high academic achievement and social awareness who is deemed in need of financial assistance.

**Harold Greenwald Memorial Scholarship**

Established in March 2006 by family and friends to honor the memory of Harold Greenwald, alumnus of the Class of 1928 and faculty member for 36 years.
