2008 Baltimore City College Hall of Fame Induction

The Hall of Fame Induction Assembly sponsored by the Alumni Association was held on October 26, 2008. Jacob Howard is the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, which chooses the inductees and conducts the induction ceremony. It is difficult to imagine a college or university, much less a public, private or parochial high school, in the United States of America with a more prestigious Hall of Fame. Their installation increases the Hall's membership to 209. Introducing the inductees:

Raymond E. Banks, BCC '65

Mr. Banks was a scholar-athlete while attending City and demonstrated his versatility by serving as a student government official while excelling on the football field and meriting selection to the BCC Athletic Hall of Fame. Career-wise, Rev. Banks devoted over 40 years as an educator and supervisor in Baltimore City Public and administrator in both city and Baltimore County Public Schools. Rev. Banks has also provided spiritual leadership for over a quarter of a century as first an itinerant elder in the AME Church and then as associate minister at Christian Community Church of God. When the Scholar-Athlete Award program-sponsored by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame – is held each year, Rev. Banks is called upon to deliver both the invocation and benediction. Incidentally, Rev. Banks is the son of the late legendary Morgan State University football coach Earl Banks.

Albert C. Robinson, BCC '69

Mr. Robinson was another scholar- Athlete who earned induction into Baltimore City College's Athletic Hall of Fame too. During his career, Mr. Robinson devoted over 40 years of service to the City of Baltimore and the State of Maryland. Mr. Robinson has donated thousands of hours to mentor, coach, and counsel students and at-risk youth as well as to various civic and political causes. As far as City College is concerned, for over 35 years Mr. Robinson has been in the forefront of every effort to improve and enhance our school's service and reputation. The beneficiaries of his efforts include the BCC Alumni Association, the BCC Trustees of the Scholarship Funds Inc., and the BCC Board of Visitors. If you need someone to show up and say a few words about City College, Al Robinson will be there and ready and able to say few thousand meaningful words.

Nolan H. Rodgers BCC '49

Mr. Rogers is also at home in the field of athletics. His credentials include recognition as an All-Maryland basketball player, All-Dixie and 3rd team All-American recognition as lacrosse defensemen at Duke University, and Hall of Fame honors from the Maryland Lacrosse Club and Greater Baltimore Lacrosse Foundation Chapter. Mr. Rogers has also served as both general and field manager of the U.S. National Lacrosse Team competing in the world championships. As far as his other career are concerned, Mr. Rogers served in the military and for over 30 years worked in the Maryland Attorney General's office during the terms of six attorneys generals from Judge C. Ferdinand Sybert to J. Joseph Curran inclusive and was adviser to four governors.

Askew "Skip" Sanders BCC '59

Mr. Sanders is another one of those BCC gradates who exhibits his versatility. For over three decades Mr. Sanders severed in a supervisory position with the Maryland State Department of Education during which he had oversight of public education reform, a \$4 billion operating budget, and 1,500 employees. Mr. Sanders is recognized as a national authority in developing educators who specialize in African-American male and minority student achievement, statewide school reform, multicultural educational issues, teacher preparation and licensing, and educational television. During the 1970's Mr. Sanders was host of a weekly program on social issues on WJZ-TV Channel 13. He also has recorded fifteen liturgical albums and given forty solo performances at sacred music programs in the U.S. and Europe.

John Borland Weaver BCC '55

Mr. Weaver continued his education at the Peabody Conservatory and served in the military after graduating from City College. Reputed to be America's most renowned concert organist, Mr. Weaver's talents have been enjoyed by thousands on recordings, in person at concert halls, and churches, and on network radio and television programs in the U.S. and Germany. Serving as music director at New York City's Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church (1970-2005), Mr. Weaver also found time to head the organ departments at both Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia (1972-2003) and Juilliard School of Music (1987-2004). Just to list a few of Mr. Weaver's honors: honorary Doctorate of Music, The Peabody Conservatory's Distinguished Alumni Award (1989), and the American Guild of Organists 'International Performer of the Year (2005).

Baltimore City College Alumni Association Scholarships

Douglas H. Rose Scholarship. Established in 1911 to enable students outstanding in scholarship and leadership to continue in college. Awarded in memory of Judge Douglas H. Rose, Class of 1880.

Jacob Agus-Kleinman

Edward L. Torsh, Class of 1868 Scholarship. Established in 1928 by Edward L. Torsh and members of the Class of 1868. Awarded to graduates most outstanding for manners and conduct as well as excellence in scholarship.

Julien Polillo

Israel Krieger Scholarship. Established in 1929 by Israel Krieger, brother of Zanvyl Krieger, Class of 1924 to enable worthy students to continue in college.

Khir Henderson

Aaron Straus Scholarship. Established in 1959 by a bequest from the Aaron Straus, Class of 1898, to further the education of worthy and needy students.

Daniel Rich

Mary R. Dudley Scholarship to Morgan State University. Established in 1972 by a bequest from the estate of Mary R. Dudley. Awarded to Black graduates who have demonstrated academic achievements, good moral character and financial need.

Brittney Butler Foliba Lima

Joseph Meyerhoff Memorial Scholarship. Initiated in 1984 by Joseph Meyerhoff, Class of 1916, and funded by the Joseph Meyerhoff Fund and Memorial Trust. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional combination of academic achievement, service to school and service to community.

Jessica Brockington

Royce Diener Fund. Established in 1984 by a gift from Royce Diener, Class of 1935. Provides annual support for the Baltimore City College co-curricular program at the discretion of the Principal.

John C. Wentz, Jr. Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Foreign or Classical Languages in memory of John C. Wentz, Jr. who taught Greek, Latin, and German at Baltimore City College from 1857 to 1862. In 1866, Wentz was elected the first president of the Alumni Association.

Hannah Walsh

Henry C. Wentz Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Biology in memory of Henry C. Wentz who taught Natural Sciences at Baltimore City College from 1882 to 1866.

Leah Goldman

Sylvan Shane Scholarship. Established in 1987 by Sylvan Shane, Class of 1936. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional achievement in Journalism as demonstrated by his or her contribution to a student publication at the Baltimore City College.

Zoe Rammelkamp

Alfred H. Moses Scholarship. Established in 1988 by Alfred H. Moses, Class of 1947. Awarded to the graduating senior who holds the greatest promise of contributing to the general community through dedication and service and who requires financial assistance to matriculate to an institution of higher education.

Calissa Randall

Hyman “ Lefty” Stern Athletic Achievement Scholarship. Established in 1988 by family of Hyman Stern, Class of 1926. Mr. Stern was the first inductee into the Baltimore City College Hall of Fame for athletic achievement. Awarded to the graduating senior selected as the outstanding athlete at Baltimore City College because he or she has lettered in at least one varsity sport and demonstrated team leadership and team play, determination, integrity and modesty and the potential for academic achievement at an institution of higher learning.

JD Merrill

Dr. Edgar F. and Phoebe R. Berman Scholarship. Established in 1989, in memory of Edgar Berman, M.D., Class of 1932, by Phoebe Berman, his wife. Commemoration revised by the Trustees in 1999 to include the name of Mrs. Berman. Awarded to the graduating senior who most exhibits a sprit of intellectual inquiry, demonstrates sincere caring for his or her fellow human beings and is in need of financial assistance.

Tiffany Giles

Corbin Gwaltney Scholarship Prize for the Class Valedictorian. Provided by Corbin Gwaltney, Class of 1939, for the Class of 1986 through the Class of 1989 and subsequently endowed in perpetuity by him in 1990. Awarded to recognize academic achievement and promise.

Zoe Rammelkamp

Andre S. Wickham Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1993 by the friends of Andre S. Wickman, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in the study of Latin at Baltimore City College in memory of Mr. Wickham who served in the Foreign Language department at his alma mater as well at other City of Baltimore high schools.

Joshua Russakis

S. Peter Lebowitz Scholarship. Established in 1944 by S. Peter Lebowitz, Class of 1948. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant achievement in the practicum program at the Baltimore City College.

Lauren Nance

Dr. Ephraim T. Lisansky Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Ephraim T. Lisansky M.D., Class of 1930, by Sylvia T. Lisansky, his wife and her family. Awarded to the graduating senior who between the freshman and senior year has made the most significant improvement in academic performance.

Joshua Neal

Hyman Cohen Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Hyman Cohen, Class of 1932, by Jo-Ann D. Cohen and Howard L. Cohen, his daughter and son. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant academic achievement in his or her four years at Baltimore City College who intends to pursue a higher education program in Elementary Education.

Tikia Duppins Jasmine Mitchell

Alan B. Snyder and Susan R. Katz-Snyder Scholarship. Established in 1997 by a gift from Alan B. Snyder, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who shows the greatest promise of contributing to the overall community through dedication and service.

Zaneta Egiefameh

Robert E. Seney Excellence in English Scholarship. Established in 1999 by his brother, John M. Seney Jr., Class of 1942, to honor the memory of Robert E. Seney, a 1944 graduate and later teacher at Baltimore City College. Awarded annually to the student who attains at least a 90 senior year grade point average, and who exhibits a high degree of development and use of the English language in all its forms, both written and oral.

Jasmine Mitchell

John F. Steadman Memorial Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002. Awarded to the senior who has achieved academically, especially in the junior and senior years. A student with demonstrated interest in Journalism, writing or some form of media will be strongly considered, as will those who have exhibited the ideals that constantly guided John F. Steadman, Class of 1945: the highest integrity and ethical standards, and a commitment to helping one's fellow man.

Mai Gottlieb

Class of February, 1943 Scholarship. Established in 2001 by the surviving members of the Baltimore City College Class of February 1943. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in epitomizing the levels of aspiration and achievement which are traditional at Baltimore City College.

Hannah Walsh

Baltimore City College Alumni Prize Scholarship. Endowed in 1995 to commemorate the founding of the Baltimore City College in 1839 and the support of their alma mater by its graduates since the founding of the Alumni Association in 1866. Awarded to the best member of the graduating senior class who has demonstrated superior academic ability, extraordinary service to the school and potential for significant achievement in an institution of higher learning.

Leland Shelton

The Campbell Bernstein Slusky Scholarship. Established in 2005 by Neil R. Berstein, Class of 1954, in memory of Irene Campbell Bernstein, his mother, and Stanton H. Slusky, his cousin, Class of 1950. Awarded to the most diversely talented graduating senior who has achieved an academic rank in the top twenty percent of his or her class and earned a varsity athletic letter and participated for at least two years in a Baltimore City College instrumental or vocal music group.

Anais Naharro-Murphy

Calvin E. Tyler, Jr. Scholarship. Established in 2005 by Calvin E. Tyler, Jr., Baltimore City College Class of 1960. Awarded annually to a graduating senior who is a resident of Baltimore and is deserving of financial assistance to attend an institution of higher learning.

Brittany Murray

Dr. Stanley Kogan Scholarship. In recognition of a graduating student exhibiting high academic achievement and social awareness who is deemed in need of financial assistance.

Harold Greenwald Memorial Scholarship

Established in March 2006 by family and friends to honor the memory of Harold Greenwald, alumnus of the Class of 1928 and faculty member for 36 years. Awarded annually to the graduating senior who demonstrates intellectual curiosity and love of American History; has achieved academic excellence in the field and intends to pursue studies at an institution of higher learning.

Hannah Walsh Elise Spencer

Judge R.H. Hammerman Memorial Scholarship

Established in October 2006 by friends, Family and Lancers Club to honor the memory of Judge Robert I.H. Hammerman. Awarded annually to the graduating senior who will be attending the Johns Hopkins University and who has financial needs.

Anais Naharro-Murphy

Lemuel C. and William M. Dunbar Scholarship

Established in 2007 by William M. Dunbar, Baltimore City College Class of 1949, in memory of his father, Lemuel C. Dunbar, Baltimore City College Class of 1923, and to commemorate the esteem which they shared for their alma mater. Awarded annually to a Baltimore City College graduating senior who has demonstrated service to the school by being elected class officer or student government officer.

Howard Winchester

The Deana and Gerald Stempler Scholarship

Established in 2007 to be awarded for the first time in 2008, by The Stempler Family Foundation. Awarded to the graduating senior who is deemed in need of financial assistance to attend an institution of higher learning

Renovation of Alumni Field

Under the leadership of Jacob Howard the Baltimore City College Alumni Association is the process of raising 1.7 million dollars to renovate Alumni Field. The athletic Field, track, and stadium are in dire need of repair. The field has become a dust bowl with most of the grass worn away. Baltimore City College has not had a track meet at the school for the past five years. The plans include a new synthetic surface installed on the field, the track will be resurfaced, and new fence installed, new benches on the grandstand, lights installed, and a press box installed. This would give our scholar athletes the type of facility a safe and decent field to perform on.
