2002 Baltimore City College Hall of Fame Induction

The Hall of Fame Induction Assembly sponsored by the Alumni Association was held on November 8, 2002. Albert Robinson is the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, which chooses the inductees and conducts the induction ceremony. It is difficult to imagine a college or university, much less a public, private or parochial high school, in the United States of America with a more prestigious Hall of Fame. Their installation increases the Hall's membership to 177. Introducing the inductees:

Veronica Antoinette Jones Freeman, BCC '82, Ms. Freeman is involved in some impressive BCC firsts-member of first coed graduating class, first woman class president, first woman graduate installed in the BCC Hall of Fame. A graduate of Loyola College with a BA degree, Ms. Freeman was an accountant for the University of Maryland-Baltimore, before joining the accounting department at McCormick & Co. Ms. Freeman has served BCC as BCCAA Board of Governors and Board of Governors and Board of Visitors member. These days, Ms. Freeman stays busy as a finance team leader at McCormick's Consumer Products Division, wife of Richard Freeman and mom of Kellye (7) and Ricky (4). As for BCC, Ms. Freeman is the longtime treasure of the Trustees of the Baltimore City College Scholarship Funds.

Nathaniel James McFadden, BCC '64, Senator MsFadden holds Bachelors and Masters degrees from Morgan State University. A 34 - year employee of the Baltimore City Public School System, Senator McFadden has held many instructor and administrator positions. Over the years, Senator McFadden has served on many commissions and boards in the public, private, charity and community service sectors. From 1982 until 1987, Senator McFadden has represented East Baltimore (2nd District) in the City Council. For many years, Senator McFadden has represented the 45th Legislative District in the Maryland State Senate serving as City Senate Delegation chair and vice-chair of the Legislative Black Caucus. As a result of last fall's election, Senator McFadden now holds the second highest leadership position in the State Senate.

Joel David Myerburg, BCC '63, Mr. Myerburg participated in extracurricular activities during his junior and senior years at BCC though in the early stages of multiple sclerosis, a condition that attacks the central nervous system. By the time he earned Bachelors degrees in sociology, political science and HWSW from the University of Maryland-College Park, Mr. Myerburg was paralyzed from the chest down and confined to a wheel chair. After two years of rehabilitation at the old Montebello Hospital, Mr. Myerburg moved to a downtown apartment designed for the disabled. Thus started a career as advocate for the disabled that led to Mr. Myerburg's founding of the Maryland Disabilities Forum in 1994. Today, Mr. Myerburg safeguards the rights of 200,000 disabled Marylanders from his special designed computerized wheel chair equipped with state-of-the-art telephone and e-mail systems.

Robert Edwin "Ed" Novak, Bcc'44, Coach Novak served aboard a U. S. Navy ship in the Pacific during WWII and was reactivated for the Korean Conflict. After WWII, Coach Novack earned a BA degree in Physical Education and Health from the University of Maryland-College Park. After Korea service, Coach Novak began a teaching/coaching career that spanned 41 years. A teacher and coach at BCC for 9 years, Coach Novack later served as athletic director at Northwestern High School (12 years) and McDonough School (13 years). In 1948, Coach Novak instituted a soccer program for kids of the type that remains popular today. A water safety instructor for over 30 years, Coach Novak is a member of the American Red Cross Safety Instructors Hall of Fame, National Football Foundation, College Hall of Fame and the Maryland State Athletic Directors Hall of Fame.

Morton Rappoport, MD, BCC '52, Dr. Rappoport earned his medical doctorate from the University of Maryland Medical School where he was a member of Alpha Omega Medical Honor Society. A resident at William Beaufort General Hospital in El Paso, Texas and researcher at Ft. Detrick (MD), Dr. Rappoport was discharged as a U.S. Army Medical Corps. Major. After serving as an infectious disease expert at University of Maryland Hospital, Dr. Rappoport was named about 20 years ago to serve as Hospital's President/CEO. Under his direction, University of Maryland Medical systems grew into a six-hospital system that admits 59,000 patients annually, has 10,000 employees and generates \$ 1 billion in patient revenue annually. Dr. Rappoport has still found time to write 50 scientific papers and teach at both the University's Medical and Pharmacy School.

Douglas H. Rose Scholarship. Established in 1911 to enable students outstanding in scholarship and leadership to continue in college. Awarded in memory of Judge Douglas H. Rose, Class of 1880.

Shanae Cotton

Edward L. Torsh, Class of 1868 Scholarship. Established in 1928 by Edward L Torsh and members of the Class of 1868. Awarded to graduates most outstanding for manners and conduct as well as excellence in scholarship.

Kevin Pully

Israel Krieger Scholarship. Established in 1929 by Israel Krieger, brother of Zanvyl Krieger, Class of 1924 to enable worthy students to continue in college.

Nora Elliott

Aaron Straus Scholarship. Established in 1959 by a bequest from the Aaron Straus, Class of 1898, to further the education of worthy and needy students.

Mary R. Dudley Scholarship to Morgan State University. Established in 1972 by a bequest from the estate of Mary R. Dudley. Awarded to Black graduates who have demonstrated academic achievements, good moral character and financial need.

Dominque Allen

Joesph Meyerhoff Memorial Scholarship. Initiated in 1984 by Joesph Meyerhoff, Class of 1916, and funded by the Joesph Meyerhoff Fund and Memorial Trust. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional combination of academic achievement, service to school and service to community.

Dorian Harris

Royce Diener Fund. Established in 1984 by a gift from Royce Diener, Class of 1935. Provides annual support for the Baltimore City College co-curricular program at the discretion of the Principal.

John C. Wentz, Jr. Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Foreign or Classical Languages in memory of John C. Weintz, Jr. who taught Greek, Latin, and German at Baltimore City College from 1857 to 1862. In 1866, Wentz was elected the first president of the Alumni Association.

Moli Fegan

Henry C. Wentz Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Biology in memory of Henry C. Wentz who taught Natural Sciences at Baltimore City College from 1882 to 1866.

Antonia Daniels

Sylvan Shane Scholarship. Established in 1987 by Sylvan Shane, Class of 1936. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional achievement in Journalism as demonstrated by his or her contribution to a student publication at the Baltimore City College.

Cari Nanton

Alfred H. Moses Scholarship. Established in 1988 by Alfred H. Moses, Class of 1947. Awarded to the graduating senior who holds the greatest promise of contributing to the general community through dedication and service and who requires financial assistance to matriculate to an institution of higher education.

Kehinde Fadojutimi

Hyman “ Lefty” Stern Athletic Achievement Scholarship. Established in 1988 by family of Hyman Stern, Class of 1926. Mr. Stern was the first inductee into the Baltimore City College Hall of Fame for athletic achievement. Awarded to the graduating senior selected as the outstanding athlete at Baltimore City College because he or she has lettered in at least one varsity sport and exemplifies determination, integrity and modesty and the potential for academic achievement at an institution of higher learning.

Markia Green

Dr. Edgar F. and Phoebe R. Berman Scholarship. Established in 1989, in memory of Edgar Berman, M.D., Class of 1932, by Phoebe Berman, his wife. Commemoration revised by the Trustees in 1999 to include the name of Mrs. Berman. Awarded to the graduating senior who most exhibits a sprit of intellectual inquiry, demonstrates sincere caring for his or her fellow human beings and is in need of financial assistance.

Paul Boone

Corbin Gwaltney Scholarship Prize for the Class Valedictorian. Provided by Corbin Gwaltney, Class of 1939, for the Class of 1986 through the Class of 1989 and subsequently endowed in perpetuity by him in 1990. Awarded to recognize academic achievement and promise.

Robert Weiblen

Andre S. Wickham Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1993 by the friends of Andre S. Wickman, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in the study of Latin at Baltimore City College in memory of Mr. Wickman who served in the Foreign Language department at his alma mater as well at other City of Baltimore high schools.

Mary Banks

S. Peter Lebowitz Scholarship. Established in 1944 by S. Peter Lebowitz, Class of 1948. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant achievement in the practicum program at the Baltimore City College.

Tavon Lawrence

Dr. Ephraim T. Lisansky Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Ephraim T. Lisansky M.D., Class of 1930, by Sylvia T. Lisansky, his wife and her family. Awarded to the graduating senior who between the freshman and senior year has made the most significant improvement in academic performance.

Danielle Bell

Hyman Cohen Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Hyman Cohen, Class of 1932, by Jo-Ann D. Cohen and Howard L. Cohen, his daughter and son. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant academic achievement in his or her four years at Baltimore City College who intends to pursue a higher education program in Elementary Education.

Alan B. Snyder and Susan R. Katz-Snyder Scholarship. Established in 1997 by a gift from Alan B. Snyder, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who shows the greatest promise of contributing to the overall community through dedication and service.

Kelly Simpson

Robert E. Seney Excellence in English Scholarship. Established in 1999 by his brother, John M. Seney Jr., Class of 1942, to honor the memory of Robert E. Senary, a 1944 graduate and later teacher at Baltimore City College. Awarded annually to the student who attains at least a 90 senior year grade point average, and who exhibits a high degree of development and use of the English language in all its forms, both written and oral.

Shaina Farfel

John F. Steadman Memorial Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002. Awarded to the senior who has achieved academically, especially in the junior and senior years. A student with demonstrated interest in Journalism, writing or some form of media will be strongly considered, as will those who have exhibited the ideals that constantly guided John F. Steadman, Class of 1945: the highest integrity and ethical standards, and a commitment to helping one's fellow man.

Tamara Fisher

Class of February, 1943 Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002.

Dytonia Reed

Baltimore City College Alumni Prize Scholarship. Endowed in 1995 to commemorate the founding of the Baltimore City College in 1839 and the support of their alma mater by its graduates since the founding of the Alumni Association in 1866. Awarded to the best member of the graduating senior class who has demonstrated superior academic ability, extraordinary service to the school and potential for significant achievement in an institution of higher learning.

The 75th Anniversary of “The Castle On The Hill” The Castle Celebration

National Register of Historical Places

Under the leadership of Neil Bernstein, the Baltimore City College Alumni Association sponsored the process of having the current site of Baltimore City College placed on the National Registry of Historic Places. On April 10, 2003 a ceremony was held to commemorate this event. A plaque designating City College as a site on the National Registry of Historic Places is on display outside of the auditorium.

The Castle Celebration Fund

The Baltimore City College Alumni Association sponsored a fund raising drive to raise 75 thousand dollars to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of “the Castle On The Hill”. This money will be used to purchase capital items that are not within the schools budget. As of the printing of this report there have been 81 one thousand dollar donors. The first item purchased was a Hammond B3 Organ. This organ is now on display in the auditorium. This fund was the idea of Jacob Howard who is the chairman of The Castle Celebration. Special thanks goes to Neil Bernstein for his hard work on this project.
