2003 Baltimore City College Hall of Fame Induction

The Hall of Fame Induction Assembly sponsored by the Alumni Association was held on November 8, 2003. Albert Robinson is the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, which chooses the inductees and conducts the induction ceremony. It is difficult to imagine a college or university, much less a public, private or parochial high school, in the United States of America with a more prestigious Hall of Fame. Their installation increases the Hall's membership to 183. Introducing the inductees:

Calvin Anderson Jr., BCC '63,

Anderson served one tour of duty in Vietnam with the U. S. Army, was wounded, and awarded the Purple Heart, Bronze Star, Combat Infantry Badge, and other decorations. A career employee of the Dept. of Health and Human Services, Office of Inspector General, Anderson retired as Director of the Health Care Administration Sanctions Staff that combats fraud in federal Medicare and Medicaid programs. Active at St. James Episcopal Church, Anderson also has many years of service to BCC. He is the past president and current treasurer of the Baltimore City College Alumni Association, and president of the Baltimore City College Trustees of the Scholarship Fund. Anderson is very proud his three children and two nephews all graduates of Baltimore City College.

John C. Burdette, Jr., BCC '39

Burdette was feature editor, writer and cartoonist for the *Collegian* newspaper while at Baltimore City College. Serving with the U. S. Army Signal Corps in the Pacific during WWII, Burdette was discharged with the rank of captain. A longtime employee of Egil & Gompf engineering company, Burdette retired in 1990 from Burdette Koehler Murphy & Assoc. - the engineering firm he co-founded in 1968.

Carl Jules Freed, BCC '42

Freed was a member of the strong Baltimore City College Black Knight football team that played at the Orange Bowl in 1941. An accomplished gymnast, Freed decided to forgo athletic competitions for extended WWII military service. Freed's post-war career was in teaching.

Rear Admiral Walter Black Massenburg USN, '65

Admiral Massenburg earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Physics at Washington and Jefferson College in Washington, PA. Entering the U.S. Navy in 1970, Admiral Massenburg qualified as an aviator. A career naval officer in support, technical and command positions, Admiral Massenburg is currently assistant commander for logistics. He is proud of his two sons, one following in his footsteps as a naval officer and the other is a University of Florida senior.

State Delegate Samuel Isadore “Sandy” Rosenberg, ‘68

A graduate of Amherst College and Columbia University Law School, Delegate Rosenberg has represented his district in Annapolis since 1983. Chairman of the Public Health Subcommittee, Delegate Rosenberg has written legislation on reproductive rights, lead paint poison prevention, education, and welfare. And of course he looks out for the interest of BCC in the Legislature

Gilbert Sandler, ‘41

Sandler made good on his career goal as printed in the 1941 Green Bag yearbook. He had a long career in advertising and public relations. Author of four books about his beloved Baltimore, Sandler wrote the “*Baltimore Glimpses*” column on the op-ed page of the *Sun* newspaper for 30 years and still comments on Baltimore Life for National Public Radio. A consultant to the Abell Foundation, Sandler administers the Foundation’s support for BCC’s Carrollton-Wright and Bancroft speech and debate societies.

Baltimore City College Alumni Association Scholarships

Douglas H. Rose Scholarship. Established in 1911 to enable students outstanding in scholarship and leadership to continue in college. Awarded in memory of Judge Douglas H. Rose, Class of 1880.

Kendra K. Thompson

Edward L. Torsh, Class of 1868 Scholarship. Established in 1928 by Edward L. Torsh and members of the Class of 1868. Awarded to graduates most outstanding for manners and conduct as well as excellence in scholarship.

Tiffany D. Easton

Israel Krieger Scholarship. Established in 1929 by Israel Krieger, brother of Zanvyl Krieger, Class of 1924 to enable worthy students to continue in college.

Brittany A. Lett

Aaron Straus Scholarship. Established in 1959 by a bequest from the Aaron Straus, Class of 1898, to further the education of worthy and needy students.

Mary R. Dudley Scholarship to Morgan State University. Established in 1972 by a bequest from the estate of Mary R. Dudley. Awarded to Black graduates who have demonstrated academic achievements, good moral character and financial need.

Krystal R. Brown

Joseph Meyerhoff Memorial Scholarship. Initiated in 1984 by Joseph Meyerhoff, Class of 1916, and funded by the Joseph Meyerhoff Fund and Memorial Trust. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional combination of academic achievement, service to school and service to community.

Cora M. Parson

Royce Diener Fund. Established in 1984 by a gift from Royce Diener, Class of 1935. Provides annual support for the Baltimore City College co-curricular program at the discretion of the Principal.

John C. Wentz, Jr. Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Foreign or Classical Languages in memory of John C. Wentz, Jr. who taught Greek, Latin, and German at Baltimore City College from 1857 to 1862. In 1866, Wentz was elected the first president of the Alumni Association.

Stephanie M. Henderson

Henry C. Wentz Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Biology in memory of Henry C. Wentz who taught Natural Sciences at Baltimore City College from 1882 to 1866.

Julia Notar

Sylvan Shane Scholarship. Established in 1987 by Sylvan Shane, Class of 1936. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional achievement in Journalism as demonstrated by his or her contribution to a student publication at the Baltimore City College.

Tia A. Green

Alfred H. Moses Scholarship. Established in 1988 by Alfred H. Moses, Class of 1947. Awarded to the graduating senior who holds the greatest promise of contributing to the general community through dedication and service and who requires financial assistance to matriculate to an institution of higher education.

Matthew C. Zimmerman

Hyman “Lefty” Stern Athletic Achievement Scholarship. Established in 1988 by family of Hyman Stern, Class of 1926. Mr. Stern was the first inductee into the Baltimore City College Hall of Fame for athletic achievement. Awarded to the graduating senior selected as the outstanding athlete at Baltimore City College because he or she has lettered in at least one varsity sport and exemplifies determination, integrity and modesty and the potential for academic achievement at an institution of higher learning.

Danyelle C. Brown

Dr. Edgar F. and Phoebe R. Berman Scholarship. Established in 1989, in memory of Edgar Berman, M.D., Class of 1932, by Phoebe Berman, his wife. Commemoration revised by the Trustees in 1999 to include the name of Mrs. Berman. Awarded to the graduating senior who most exhibits a spirit of intellectual inquiry, demonstrates sincere caring for his or her fellow human beings and is in need of financial assistance.

Zoe C. Lintzeris

Corbin Gwaltney Scholarship Prize for the Class Valedictorian. Provided by Corbin Gwaltney, Class of 1939, for the Class of 1986 through the Class of 1989 and subsequently endowed in perpetuity by him in 1990. Awarded to recognize academic achievement and promise.

Alexander Marzo Borinsky

Andre S. Wickham Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1993 by the friends of Andre S. Wickman, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in the study of Latin at Baltimore City College in memory of Mr. Wickham who served in the Foreign Language department at his alma mater as well at other City of Baltimore high schools.

Christopher J. Borkoski

S. Peter Lebowitz Scholarship. Established in 1944 by S. Peter Lebowitz, Class of 1948. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant achievement in the practicum program at the Baltimore City College.

Taylor E. Graham

Dr. Ephraim T. Lisansky Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Ephraim T. Lisansky M.D., Class of 1930, by Sylvia T. Lisansky, his wife and her family. Awarded to the graduating senior who between the freshman and senior year has made the most significant improvement in academic performance.

Cierra Danyelle Lewis

Hyman Cohen Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Hyman Cohen, Class of 1932, by Jo-Ann D. Cohen and Howard L. Cohen, his daughter and son. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant academic achievement in his or her four years at Baltimore City College who intends to pursue a higher education program in Elementary Education.

Cierra Danyele Lewis

Alan B. Snyder and Susan R. Katz-Snyder Scholarship. Established in 1997 by a gift from Alan B. Snyder, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who shows the greatest promise of contributing to the overall community through dedication and service.

Stuart O. Pope, Jr.

Robert E. Seney Excellence in English Scholarship. Established in 1999 by his brother, John M. Seney Jr., Class of 1942, to honor the memory of Robert E. Seney, a 1944 graduate and later teacher at Baltimore City College. Awarded annually to the student who attains at least a 90 senior year grade point average, and who exhibits a high degree of development and use of the English language in all its forms, both written and oral.

Dawnyea Jackson

John F. Steadman Memorial Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002. Awarded to the senior who has achieved academically, especially in the junior and senior years. A student with demonstrated interest in Journalism, writing or some form of media will be strongly considered, as will those who have exhibited the ideals that constantly guided John F. Steadman, Class of 1945: the highest integrity and ethical standards, and a commitment to helping one's fellow man.

Sophia R. Koshland

Class of February, 1943 Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002.

Teyrra D. Yancey

Baltimore City College Alumni Prize Scholarship. Endowed in 1995 to commemorate the founding of the Baltimore City College in 1839 and the support of their alma mater by its graduates since the founding of the Alumni Association in 1866. Awarded to the best member of the graduating senior class who has demonstrated superior academic ability, extraordinary service to the school and potential for significant achievement in an institution of higher learning.

2003-2004 Baltimore City College Alumni Association Accomplishments

The Castle Celebration Fund

The Baltimore City College Alumni Association sponsored a fund raising drive to raise 75 thousand dollars to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of “the Castle On The Hill”. This money will be used to purchase capital items that are not within the schools budget. As of the printing of this report there have been 81 one thousand dollar donors. The items purchased so far were a Hammond B3 Organ, podium, 3 chairs for the auditorium, plaque to honor City College vets who died in Vietnam, and 2 additional Hall of Fame plaques. This organ is now on display in the auditorium. This fund was the idea of Jacob Howard who is the chairman of The Castle Celebration. Special thanks go to Neil Bernstein for his hard work on this project. The total funds raised were \$92,737.

Open House

Several members of the Alumni Association participated in the schools Open House. The President of the Trustees of BCC Scholarship Fund addressed the prospective students and informed them of the role of the Alumni Association. The Alumni Association had a information table and talked to the students and their families.

Football Games

During the home football games members of the Alumni Association served as the public address announcer. The Alumni Association also filmed the games for the football team.

Golden Apple Award

The Alumni Association sponsored the Hall of Fame Induction ceremony and luncheon that followed. Al Robinson is the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee.

Athletic Banquet

As it does every year the Alumni Association sponsored the Annual Athletic Banquet. Over a hundred Baltimore City College athletes and their families attended this affair. These students were honored for their athletic achievements.

Meeting With Chief Academic Officer

The Baltimore City College Alumni Association Defense Team met with Chief Academic Officer Cassandra Jones and the Budget Director of the Baltimore City Public Schools. This meeting was held to make sure the school's budget was not cut severely.

Meeting with CEO

Members of the Public Relations Committee of the Board of Governors met several times with the CEO of Baltimore City Public Schools. At these meetings the committee expressed their concerns on the following issues concerning Baltimore City College and its former principal. The small enrollment of male students enrolled in the school. At the present time the ratio of male students is approximately 20% compared to 80 % female students. The small amount of African American teachers now at the school. There are approximately fewer than 20 African American faculty members. There are less than 5 African American male teachers on the staff. The faculty at Baltimore City College has the 2nd highest turnover rate in the public school system. Only Patterson High School has a larger turnover rate. More than 200 teachers have left in the past ten years. Our final concern is the unfair enforcement of eligibility requirement for co-curricular activities. All students are not being held to these guide lines. Students on athletic teams are made to follow these rules, but other students do not have to follow these rules. After these meetings, the CEO agreed that these issues were valid. At this time these issues are trying to be resolved.

After School Tutorial Program

The Alumni Association provided financial assistance to pay tutors who worked in the after school tutorial program.

After School Computer Lab

The after school computer lab program was sponsored by the Alumni Association. This program allows students to use the computers to work on the school projects.

Alumni Association Newsletter

Under the leadership of Ted Lingelbach the Alumni Association continued to publish an outstanding newsletter.

Principal Search Committee

Calvin Anderson, Jr. and Michael Hamilton represented the Baltimore City College Alumni Association on the search committee for a new principal.

Believe in Schools Clean Up

Several members of Baltimore City College participated in the City of Baltimore Believe program to clean up and paint schools. Interior classrooms and halls were paint prior to the opening of the school year.

Auditorium and Grounds Clean Up

Several members of the Alumni Association cleaned up the back stage area of the auditorium and grounds of the school.

Civil Rights Tour

The Alumni Association provided financial assistance to students to attend a tour of historic Civil Rights sites in the South. Students from City College and Park School toured Atlanta, GA, Memphis, TN and several Alabama cities.

Girls Championship Banner

The Varsity Girls Basketball team won the Baltimore City Championship. The Alumni Association purchase a championship banner to hung in the gym.

Alumni Gift of \$100,000

David M. Rubenstein, The Carlyle Group, donated \$100,000 to the Baltimore City College Alumni Association for distribution to various organizations within the City College family.
