2004 Baltimore City College Hall of Fame Induction

The Hall of Fame Induction Assembly sponsored by the Alumni Association was held on October 14, 2004. Albert Robinson is the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, which chooses the inductees and conducts the induction ceremony. It is difficult to imagine a college or university, much less a public, private or parochial high school, in the United States of America with a more prestigious Hall of Fame. Their installation increases the Hall's membership to 183. Introducing the inductees:

Emil A. "Buzzy" Budnitz Jr., BCC '49

Excelled in lacrosse and soccer at BCC and Johns Hopkins University and was voted an All-American in both sports while in college. Since 1953, except for two years in the military, Mr. Budnitz has been an award winning insurance advisor and has written and lectured extensively on insurance topics and led many industry organizations. As far as athletic and academic honors are concerned, Mr. Budnitz has been elected to both the Maryland State and JHU Athletic Halls of Fame and served as president of the JHU Alumni Association.

Dr. Sidney Krome, BCC '55

Was an English professor and administrator at Coppin State College from 1970 until 2001 and currently is Professor emeritus and an adjunct faculty member. While at Coppin, Dr. Krome team-taught many innovative courses and served as vice-president for administrative affairs among other posts. A scholar on Biblical, Slavery and Holocaust Literature, Dr. Krome is also well known as a published author, book reviewer, commentator, and poet. In recent years, Dr. Krome wrote the narrative for a proposal in the World Trade Center Memorial design competition.

David M. Rubenstein, BCC '66

Mr. Rubenstein graduated from Duke University and the University of Chicago Law School. In the 1970's and 1980's, Mr. Rubenstein practiced law in New York City and Washington, D.C., and served as a U.S. Senate subcommittee counsel and domestic policy advisor in President Jimmy Carter's Administration. In 1987, Mr. Rubenstein co-founded The Carlyle Group—one of the largest private equity firms in the world. These days, Mr. Rubenstein is managing director of The Carlyle Group and has a seat on many commissions and boards.

Elizabeth D. "Betty" Savage, Honorary BCC

A dedicated member of the Baltimore City College Staff for decades whose thoughtful demeanor has encouraged students to be Collegians.

Calvin Tyler, Jr., BCC'60

Mr. Tyler attended Morgan State University for two years before getting married and becoming one of the first United Parcel Service (UPS) employees in Baltimore. During a 34-year career, Mr. Tyler worked his way up the corporate ladder from delivery truck driver to senior vice president for operations and board member. Retired since 1998, Mr. Tyler sits on several boards is a philanthropist (BCC, Morgan State University, etc.) and resides with his wife, Tina a native Baltimorean, too, in the Las Vegas suburbs in Henderson, NV.

Baltimore City College Alumni Association Scholarships

Douglas H. Rose Scholarship. Established in 1911 to enable students outstanding in scholarship and leadership to continue in college. Awarded in memory of Judge Douglas H. Rose, Class of 1880.

TiAwna Moffatt

Edward L. Torsh, Class of 1868 Scholarship. Established in 1928 by Edward L. Torsh and members of the Class of 1868. Awarded to graduates most outstanding for manners and conduct as well as excellence in scholarship.

Adedayo Bolaji-Adio

Israel Krieger Scholarship. Established in 1929 by Israel Krieger, brother of Zanvyl Krieger, Class of 1924 to enable worthy students to continue in college.

Allegra Hild

Aaron Straus Scholarship. Established in 1959 by a bequest from the Aaron Straus, Class of 1898, to further the education of worthy and needy students.

Christen Cromwell

Mary R. Dudley Scholarship to Morgan State University. Established in 1972 by a bequest from the estate of Mary R. Dudley. Awarded to Black graduates who have demonstrated academic achievements, good moral character and financial need.

Adewale Adeoye

Joseph Meyerhoff Memorial Scholarship. Initiated in 1984 by Joseph Meyerhoff, Class of 1916, and funded by the Joseph Meyerhoff Fund and Memorial Trust. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional combination of academic achievement, service to school and service to community.

Ariella Foss

Royce Diener Fund. Established in 1984 by a gift from Royce Diener, Class of 1935. Provides annual support for the Baltimore City College co-curricular program at the discretion of the Principal.

John C. Wentz, Jr. Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Foreign or Classical Languages in memory of John C. Wentz, Jr. who taught Greek, Latin, and German at Baltimore City College from 1857 to 1862. In 1866, Wentz was elected the first president of the Alumni Association.

Jennifer Akchin

Henry C. Wentz Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Biology in memory of Henry C. Wentz who taught Natural Sciences at Baltimore City College from 1882 to 1866.

Onyinyech Jeremiah

Sylvan Shane Scholarship. Established in 1987 by Sylvan Shane, Class of 1936. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional achievement in Journalism as demonstrated by his or her contribution to a student publication at the Baltimore City College.

Rachel Jackson

Alfred H. Moses Scholarship. Established in 1988 by Alfred H. Moses, Class of 1947. Awarded to the graduating senior who holds the greatest promise of contributing to the general community through dedication and service and who requires financial assistance to matriculate to an institution of higher education.

Monique House

Hyman “ Lefty” Stern Athletic Achievement Scholarship. Established in 1988 by family of Hyman Stern, Class of 1926. Mr. Stern was the first inductee into the Baltimore City College Hall of Fame for athletic achievement. Awarded to the graduating senior selected as the outstanding athlete at Baltimore City College because he or she has lettered in at least one varsity sport and demonstrated team leadership and team play, determination, integrity and modesty and the potential for academic achievement at an institution of higher learning.

Kaylin Young

Dr. Edgar F. and Phoebe R. Berman Scholarship. Established in 1989, in memory of Edgar Berman, M.D., Class of 1932, by Phoebe Berman, his wife. Commemoration revised by the Trustees in 1999 to include the name of Mrs. Berman. Awarded to the graduating senior who most exhibits a spirit of intellectual inquiry, demonstrates sincere caring for his or her fellow human beings and is in need of financial assistance.

Lindsay Bynum

Corbin Gwaltney Scholarship Prize for the Class Valedictorian. Provided by Corbin Gwaltney, Class of 1939, for the Class of 1986 through the Class of 1989 and subsequently endowed in perpetuity by him in 1990. Awarded to recognize academic achievement and promise.

Alexander Vizzi

Andre S. Wickham Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1993 by the friends of Andre S. Wickman, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in the study of Latin at Baltimore City College in memory of Mr. Wickham who served in the Foreign Language department at his alma mater as well at other City of Baltimore high schools.

Devon Nwaba

S. Peter Lebowitz Scholarship. Established in 1944 by S. Peter Lebowitz, Class of 1948. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant achievement in the practicum program at the Baltimore City College.

DienPham

Dr. Ephraim T. Lisansky Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Ephraim T. Lisansky M.D., Class of 1930, by Sylvia T. Lisansky, his wife and her family. Awarded to the graduating senior who between the freshman and senior year has made the most significant improvement in academic performance.

Cynthea Hayes

Hyman Cohen Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Hyman Cohen, Class of 1932, by Jo-Ann D. Cohen and Howard L. Cohen, his daughter and son. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant academic achievement in his or her four years at Baltimore City College who intends to pursue a higher education program in Elementary Education.

Alan B. Snyder and Susan R. Katz-Snyder Scholarship. Established in 1997 by a gift from Alan B. Snyder, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who shows the greatest promise of contributing to the overall community through dedication and service.

Annie Githua

Robert E. Seney Excellence in English Scholarship. Established in 1999 by his brother, John M. Seney Jr., Class of 1942, to honor the memory of Robert E. Seney, a 1944 graduate and later teacher at Baltimore City College. Awarded annually to the student who attains at least a 90 senior year grade point average, and who exhibits a high degree of development and use of the English language in all its forms, both written and oral.

Martin Stukes

John F. Steadman Memorial Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002. Awarded to the senior who has achieved academically, especially in the junior and senior years. A student with demonstrated interest in Journalism, writing or some form of media will be strongly considered, as will those who have exhibited the ideals that constantly guided John F. Steadman, Class of 1945: the highest integrity and ethical standards, and a commitment to helping one's fellow man.

Olivia Claxton

Class of February, 1943 Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002.

Dayo Simms

Baltimore City College Alumni Prize Scholarship. Endowed in 1995 to commemorate the founding of the Baltimore City College in 1839 and the support of their alma mater by its graduates since the founding of the Alumni Association in 1866. Awarded to the best member of the graduating senior class who has demonstrated superior academic ability, extraordinary service to the school and potential for significant achievement in an institution of higher learning.

2004-2005 Baltimore City College Alumni Association Accomplishments

The Castle Celebration Fund

The Baltimore City College Alumni Association sponsored a fund raising drive to raise 75 thousand dollars to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of “the Castle On The Hill”. This money will be used to purchase capital items that are not within the schools budget. As of the printing of this report there have been 81 one thousand dollar donors. The items purchased so far are a Hammond B3 Organ, podium, 3 chairs for the auditorium, plaque to honor City College vets who died in Vietnam, scores table for the gym, 50 coaches chairs for the gym, and 2 additional Hall of Fame plaques. This organ is now on display in the auditorium. This fund was the idea of Jacob Howard who is the chairman of The Castle Celebration. Special thanks go to Neil Bernstein for his hard work on this project. The total funds raised were \$92,737.

Open House

Several members of the Alumni Association participated in the schools Open House. The President of the Trustees of BCC Scholarship Fund addressed the prospective students and informed them of the role of the Alumni Association. The Alumni Association had an information table and talked to the students and their families.

Football Games
