2005 Baltimore City College Hall of Fame Induction

The Hall of Fame Induction Assembly sponsored by the Alumni Association was held on October 28, 2005. Albert Robinson is the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, which chooses the inductees and conducts the induction ceremony. It is difficult to imagine a college or university, much less a public, private or parochial high school, in the United States of America with a more prestigious Hall of Fame. Their installation increases the Hall's membership to 188. Introducing the inductees:

Rev. Joseph J. Bonadio S.S. BCC '55

Fr. Bonadio was ordained as a priest for the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore in 1964. As a member of the Church's Sulpician order, Fr. Bonadio's initial assignments were to teach seminarians at St. Thomas Seminary in Louisville Kentucky and St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore's Roland Park. As rector at St. Patrick's Seminary/University in Melo Park, CA Fr. Bonadio influenced seminarians to re-focus on their primary objectives in those days of turmoil in our country. After an assignment at Catholic University, Fr. Bonadio organized St. Mary's Spiritual Center in downtown Baltimore. Today, Fr. Bonadio is active as director of his Order's St. Charles Villa, Chaplain for the Roman Catholic Community at Oak Ridge Village retirement community in Parkville, and as weekend priest at St. Francis of Assisi parish a mile or so from Baltimore City College.

Joseph S. Freed, BCC '66

Mr. Freed has earned a reputation as a master educator, polished administrator, and gifted artist. Possessor of an undergraduate degree from UMBC and a Master's Degree in Education from Loyola College, Mr. Freed continues to pursue studies at UMBC and Maryland Institute College of Art. A former English teacher and department head in Baltimore County schools, Mr. Freed was named assistant principal at Central School of Technology at Towson in 1992. It was part of Mr. Freed's job there to plan and facilitate the renovation and smooth conversion of that school into Carver Center for Art's and Technology. Principal since 2000, Mr. Freed presided over the rise of Carver Center to its current ranking among the top 4% of high schools in the USA according to Newsweek magazine.

Major Keven Louis Gray, BCC'71

Major Gray rose through the ranks over the past 27 years from trooper to his current position of major and is the highest ranking African-American in the Maryland State Police. Major Gray's Maryland State Police assignments include academy instructor, medivac flight paramedic, and commanding officer of both the busy JFK (I-95 north of Baltimore) Highway barracks and the Maryland State Police Equal Opportunity office. Active in the International Association of Chief's of Police, Major Gray has found time to earn three degrees and complete the FBI National Academy course. Recognized for his dedication to mentoring at risk young people, Major Gray volunteers to help coach Baltimore City College's football team

Neil A. Seidenman, BCC '51

Mr. Seidenman opted to participate in a State Department sponsored language program while attending Georgetown University. Mr. Seidenman studied in Rome under the program and was certified as fluent in Italian, Portuguese, and Spanish. After service with the U. S. Army in the Panama Canal Zone, Mr. Seidenman joined the State Department as an interpreter with security clearance. There he provided linguistic services for Presidents Kennedy, Johnson, Nixon, Carter, Regan, and Bush #41. In remarks to current Bcc students at the Hall of Fame Induction, Mr. Seidenman urged them to take advantage of the same State department language program which is still in existence.

Robert J. "Bob" Terpening, BCC'60

Mr. Terpening was a four year defensive standout on the gridiron at what is now Shepard University at Shepherdstown, WV. Returning to Baltimore City College after earning his degree, Coach Terpening taught physical education and coached three sports (football, lacrosse, and wrestling) while earning a master's degree from West Virginia University. Elevated to head football coach at Baltimore City College when the late Coach George Young left to work for the NFL. Coach Terpening reviewed game films and scouted personnel for the New England Patriots and old Baltimore Colts. As Director of Personnel, Coach Terpening moved with the Colts to Indianapolis and was promoted to his current position as Executive Vice President. Ties established by Coach Terpening have led many Baltimore City College athletes to earn a scholarship and play at Shepherd University.

Baltimore City College Alumni Association Scholarships

Douglas H. Rose Scholarship. Established in 1911 to enable students outstanding in scholarship and leadership to continue in college. Awarded in memory of Judge Douglas H. Rose, Class of 1880.

Ben Waldron

Edward L. Torsh, Class of 1868 Scholarship. Established in 1928 by Edward L. Torsh and members of the Class of 1868. Awarded to graduates most outstanding for manners and conduct as well as excellence in scholarship.

Chantel Morant

Israel Krieger Scholarship. Established in 1929 by Israel Krieger, brother of Zanvyl Krieger, Class of 1924 to enable worthy students to continue in college.

Aaron Straus Scholarship. Established in 1959 by a bequest from the Aaron Straus, Class of 1898, to further the education of worthy and needy students.

Mary R. Dudley Scholarship to Morgan State University. Established in 1972 by a bequest from the estate of Mary R. Dudley. Awarded to Black graduates who have demonstrated academic achievements, good moral character and financial need.

Joseph Meyerhoff Memorial Scholarship. Initiated in 1984 by Joseph Meyerhoff, Class of 1916, and funded by the Joseph Meyerhoff Fund and Memorial Trust. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional combination of academic achievement, service to school and service to community.

Connie Yarborough

Royce Diener Fund. Established in 1984 by a gift from Royce Diener, Class of 1935. Provides annual support for the Baltimore City College co-curricular program at the discretion of the Principal.

John C. Wentz, Jr. Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Foreign or Classical Languages in memory of John C. Wentz, Jr. who taught Greek, Latin, and German at Baltimore City College from 1857 to 1862. In 1866, Wentz was elected the first president of the Alumni Association.

Amirah Muhammad

Henry C. Wentz Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Biology in memory of Henry C. Wentz who taught Natural Sciences at Baltimore City College from 1882 to 1866.

Tanisha Cottom

Sylvan Shane Scholarship. Established in 1987 by Sylvan Shane, Class of 1936. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional achievement in Journalism as demonstrated by his or her contribution to a student publication at the Baltimore City College.

Bria Spease

Alfred H. Moses Scholarship. Established in 1988 by Alfred H. Moses, Class of 1947. Awarded to the graduating senior who holds the greatest promise of contributing to the general community through dedication and service and who requires financial assistance to matriculate to an institution of higher education.

Tiffany Jones

Hyman “ Lefty” Stern Athletic Achievement Scholarship. Established in 1988 by family of Hyman Stern, Class of 1926. Mr. Stern was the first inductee into the Baltimore City College Hall of Fame for athletic achievement. Awarded to the graduating senior selected as the outstanding athlete at Baltimore City College because he or she has lettered in at least one varsity sport and demonstrated team leadership and team play, determination, integrity and modesty and the potential for academic achievement at an institution of higher learning.

Brionn Johnson

Dr. Edgar F. and Phoebe R. Berman Scholarship. Established in 1989, in memory of Edgar Berman, M.D., Class of 1932, by Phoebe Berman, his wife. Commemoration revised by the Trustees in 1999 to include the name of Mrs. Berman. Awarded to the graduating senior who most exhibits a spirit of intellectual inquiry, demonstrates sincere caring for his or her fellow human beings and is in need of financial assistance.

Isaac Weingram

Corbin Gwaltney Scholarship Prize for the Class Valedictorian. Provided by Corbin Gwaltney, Class of 1939, for the Class of 1986 through the Class of 1989 and subsequently endowed in perpetuity by him in 1990. Awarded to recognize academic achievement and promise.

Alena Davidoff-Gore

Andre S. Wickham Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1993 by the friends of Andre S. Wickman, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in the study of Latin at Baltimore City College in memory of Mr. Wickham who served in the Foreign Language department at his alma mater as well at other City of Baltimore high schools.

Nicholas Carter

S. Peter Lebowitz Scholarship. Established in 1944 by S. Peter Lebowitz, Class of 1948. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant achievement in the practicum program at the Baltimore City College.

Sheldon Bell

Dr. Ephraim T. Lisansky Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Ephraim T. Lisansky M.D., Class of 1930, by Sylvia T. Lisansky, his wife and her family. Awarded to the graduating senior who between the freshman and senior year has made the most significant improvement in academic performance.

Amanda Carter

Hyman Cohen Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Hyman Cohen, Class of 1932, by Jo-Ann D. Cohen and Howard L. Cohen, his daughter and son. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant academic achievement in his or her four years at Baltimore City College who intends to pursue a higher education program in Elementary Education.

Ashlie Dubose

Alan B. Snyder and Susan R. Katz-Snyder Scholarship. Established in 1997 by a gift from Alan B. Snyder, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who shows the greatest promise of contributing to the overall community through dedication and service.

Kristal Willoughby

Robert E. Seney Excellence in English Scholarship. Established in 1999 by his brother, John M. Seney Jr., Class of 1942, to honor the memory of Robert E. Seney, a 1944 graduate and later teacher at Baltimore City College. Awarded annually to the student who attains at least a 90 senior year grade point average, and who exhibits a high degree of development and use of the English language in all its forms, both written and oral.

Samuel Ball-Brau

John F. Steadman Memorial Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002. Awarded to the senior who has achieved academically, especially in the junior and senior years. A student with demonstrated interest in Journalism, writing or some form of media will be strongly considered, as will those who have exhibited the ideals that constantly guided John F. Steadman, Class of 1945: the highest integrity and ethical standards, and a commitment to helping one's fellow man.

Justin Jones

Class of February, 1943 Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002.

Gregory Shaeffer

Baltimore City College Alumni Prize Scholarship. Endowed in 1995 to commemorate the founding of the Baltimore City College in 1839 and the support of their alma mater by its graduates since the founding of the Alumni Association in 1866. Awarded to the best member of the graduating senior class who has demonstrated superior academic ability, extraordinary service to the school and potential for significant achievement in an institution of higher learning.

Ian Miers

The Campbell Bernstein Slusky Scholarship. Established in 2005 by Neil R. Berstein, Class of 1954, in memory of Irene Campbell Bernstein, his mother, and Stanton H. Slusky, his cousin, Class of 1950. Awarded to the most diversely talented graduating senior who has achieved an academic rank in the top twenty percent of his or her class and earned a varsity athletic letter and participated for at least two years in a Baltimore City College instrumental or vocal music group.

Zeshara Cosby

Calvin E. Tyler, Jr. Scholarship. Established in 2005 by Calvin E. Tyler, Jr., Baltimore City College Class of 1960. Awarded annually to a graduating senior who is a resident of Baltimore and is deserving of financial assistance to attend an institution of higher learning.

John Adsit

Dr. Stanley Kogan Scholarship. In recognition of a graduating student exhibiting high academic achievement and social awareness who is deemed in need of financial assistance.
