2007 Baltimore City College Hall of Fame Induction

The Hall of Fame Induction Assembly sponsored by the Alumni Association was held on October 26, 2007. Albert Robinson is the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, which chooses the inductees and conducts the induction ceremony. It is difficult to imagine a college or university, much less a public, private or parochial high school, in the United States of America with a more prestigious Hall of Fame. Their installation increases the Hall's membership to 204. Introducing the inductees:

Robert D. Hormats, BCC '61

Introduced by Ciera Butts

Mr. Hormats was a Baltimore County resident whose parents paid to allow him to attend Baltimore City College. Mr. Hormats matriculated to Tufts University where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree and added a MA and Ph.D. degrees in international economics. Over a fourteen year period Mr. Hormats served as senior foreign affairs adviser to President Nixon, Ford, Carter, and Regan. These days Mr. Hormats is a major player on the world financial scene as Vice Chairman of Goldman, Sachs & Co. and author of "The Price of Liberty: Paying for America's Wars" that made the New York Times best-seller list.

Jacob D. Howard, III, BCC '74

Introduced by Octavia Davis

Mr. Howard attended University of Maryland Baltimore County, and earned a BA degree. During his stay at UMBC Mr. Howard became a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc. Mr. Howard is a member of St. James Episcopal Church Lafayette Square. Mr. Howard is a Property Manager in the Global Corporate Services division of CB Richard Ellis. Presently, he is assigned to the Bank of America account managing over 70 Banking Centers in Maryland. If this was not enough for consideration, Mr. Howard has a history of 20 years stellar service to Baltimore City College and its alumni association. At the present time he is in the midst of yet another term as Baltimore City College Alumni Association president and is secretary to the Trustees of the Scholarship Funds of the Baltimore City College. Mr. Howard and his wife Michelle are also parents of two Baltimore City College graduates Christopher '00 and Brittany '03.

Julian Lee Lapidès BCC '49

Introduced by J.D. Merrill

Mr. Lapidès attended Johns Hopkins University, earned a B.S. degree from what's now Towson University, and law degree from the University of Maryland School of Law. Once a key member of the Maryland General Assembly, Mr. Lapidès won a reputation as a frugal budgeter, sage, defender of Baltimore City, and the "conscience" of the State Senate. Mr. Lapidès's lists of affiliations include Baltimore Heritage, life membership in the NAACP, and board positions with various cultural and service organizations and foundations. Today Mr. Lapidès continues to fight for what he believes in and isn't afraid to tackle controversial subject head-on.

Webster Samuel Lewis, Jr. BCC '61

Introduced by Celia Neustadt

Posthumously represented by his wife Monica

Mr. Lewis earned a degree from what's now known as Morgan State University where he helped found Iota Phi Theta Fraternity Inc. Mr. Lewis went on to earn masters degrees at Boston College, and New England Conservatory of Music and teach at the Conservatory and Howard University. California beckoned and Mr. Lewis moved to Los Angeles to join Epic records as an arranger, composer, conductor, and producer. The talent he worked with reads like a "Who's Who of the Music World" – Lola Falana, Herbie Hancock, Thelma Houston, Michael Jackson, The Jackson's, Tom Jones, Gwen McCrae, Barry White, Michael Wycoff, etc. Mr. Lewis is also survived, by his daughter Yana.

Herbert Matz BCC'32

Introduced by Jasmine Nance

Herbert Matz was captain on the basketball team at City College and also excelled in baseball, football and soccer. Mr. Matz also captained the basketball team at the University of Baltimore, where he earned a law degree. A member of the Baltimore City Solicitors staff before serving during WWII as a military legal counsel at Wendover AFB, Mr. Matz went into private practice after the War and served on the state parole commission. When the Baltimore City College Alumni Association was reactivated it was Mr. Matz who did the legal paperwork to restore corporate and tax-exempt status. These days in his 94th year Mr. Matz works out daily at a Pikesville gym. Herbert Matz is the father of Ronald L. "Ron" Matz BCC'64 a veteran WJZ-TV news reporter.

George Howard Phipps

Introduced by Sean Morant

Mr. Phipps went to high school on Maryland's Lower Eastern Shore and attended the University of Maryland College Park before transferring to Western Maryland College. He excelled in three sports and graduated with honors, started a teaching career, served a short military hitch at the end of the Korean conflict, and then returned to the classroom. Coach Phipps' days as a sports mentor started at Forest Park High School and blossomed in 1960 when he was transferred to City as head basketball coach. Over the next 8 years the Black Knights won 133 (or 83% of their) games, four MSA championships, and forty straight games over two seasons. Coach Phipps then coached at Community College of Baltimore where his teams won 360 games and 12 state titles in 14 years.

Baltimore City College Alumni Association Scholarships

Douglas H. Rose Scholarship. Established in 1911 to enable students outstanding in scholarship and leadership to continue in college. Awarded in memory of Judge Douglas H. Rose, Class of 1880.

Amanda Charlene Rogers

Edward L. Torsh, Class of 1868 Scholarship. Established in 1928 by Edward L. Torsh and members of the Class of 1868. Awarded to graduates most outstanding for manners and conduct as well as excellence in scholarship.

Sherella C. Cupid

Israel Krieger Scholarship. Established in 1929 by Israel Krieger, brother of Zanvyl Krieger, Class of 1924 to enable worthy students to continue in college.

Tyiesha Erica Brown

Aaron Straus Scholarship. Established in 1959 by a bequest from the Aaron Straus, Class of 1898, to further the education of worthy and needy students.

Nathan H. Dize

Mary R. Dudley Scholarship to Morgan State University. Established in 1972 by a bequest from the estate of Mary R. Dudley. Awarded to Black graduates who have demonstrated academic achievements, good moral character and financial need.

Christian Clause Eric Midder

Joseph Meyerhoff Memorial Scholarship. Initiated in 1984 by Joseph Meyerhoff, Class of 1916, and funded by the Joseph Meyerhoff Fund and Memorial Trust. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional combination of academic achievement, service to school and service to community.

Celia Rebbecca Neustadt

Royce Diener Fund. Established in 1984 by a gift from Royce Diener, Class of 1935. Provides annual support for the Baltimore City College co-curricular program at the discretion of the Principal.

John C. Wentz, Jr. Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Foreign or Classical Languages in memory of John C. Wentz, Jr. who taught Greek, Latin, and German at Baltimore City College from 1857 to 1862. In 1866, Wentz was elected the first president of the Alumni Association.

Amanda Charlene Rogers

Henry C. Wentz Memorial Prize Scholarship. Established in 1984 by a bequest from Frances Virginia Wentz Turner. Awarded for achievement in Biology in memory of Henry C. Wentz who taught Natural Sciences at Baltimore City College from 1882 to 1866.

Celia Rebecca Neustadt

Sylvan Shane Scholarship. Established in 1987 by Sylvan Shane, Class of 1936. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most exceptional achievement in Journalism as demonstrated by his or her contribution to a student publication at the Baltimore City College.

Deanna Marie Clark

Alfred H. Moses Scholarship. Established in 1988 by Alfred H. Moses, Class of 1947. Awarded to the graduating senior who holds the greatest promise of contributing to the general community through dedication and service and who requires financial assistance to matriculate to an institution of higher education.

Jesse Hassinger

Hyman “ Lefty” Stern Athletic Achievement Scholarship. Established in 1988 by family of Hyman Stern, Class of 1926. Mr. Stern was the first inductee into the Baltimore City College Hall of Fame for athletic achievement. Awarded to the graduating senior selected as the outstanding athlete at Baltimore City College because he or she has lettered in at least one varsity sport and demonstrated team leadership and team play, determination, integrity and modesty and the potential for academic achievement at an institution of higher learning.

Octavia Denice Davis

Dr. Edgar F. and Phoebe R. Berman Scholarship. Established in 1989, in memory of Edgar Berman, M.D., Class of 1932, by Phoebe Berman, his wife. Commemoration revised by the Trustees in 1999 to include the name of Mrs. Berman. Awarded to the graduating senior who most exhibits a sprit of intellectual inquiry, demonstrates sincere caring for his or her fellow human beings and is in need of financial assistance.

Cassandra Ashley Cobbs

Corbin Gwaltney Scholarship Prize for the Class Valedictorian. Provided by Corbin Gwaltney, Class of 1939, for the Class of 1986 through the Class of 1989 and subsequently endowed in perpetuity by him in 1990. Awarded to recognize academic achievement and promise.

Celia Rebecca Neustadt

Andre S. Wickham Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1993 by the friends of Andre S. Wickman, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in the study of Latin at Baltimore City College in memory of Mr. Wickham who served in the Foreign Language department at his alma mater as well at other City of Baltimore high schools.

Justin McCallister Dutton

S. Peter Lebowitz Scholarship. Established in 1944 by S. Peter Lebowitz, Class of 1948. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant achievement in the practicum program at the Baltimore City College.

Tonya C. Brown-Hurst

Dr. Ephraim T. Lisansky Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Ephraim T. Lisansky M.D., Class of 1930, by Sylvia T. Lisansky, his wife and her family. Awarded to the graduating senior who between the freshman and senior year has made the most significant improvement in academic performance.

Siara S. McDonald

Hyman Cohen Memorial Scholarship. Established in 1944 in memory of Hyman Cohen, Class of 1932, by Jo-Ann D. Cohen and Howard L. Cohen, his daughter and son. Awarded to the graduating senior with the most significant academic achievement in his or her four years at Baltimore City College who intends to pursue a higher education program in Elementary Education.

Tierra Jana'e Gilmore

Alan B. Snyder and Susan R. Katz-Snyder Scholarship. Established in 1997 by a gift from Alan B. Snyder, Class of 1960. Awarded to the graduating senior who shows the greatest promise of contributing to the overall community through dedication and service.

Deanna Marie Clark

Robert E. Seney Excellence in English Scholarship. Established in 1999 by his brother, John M. Seney Jr., Class of 1942, to honor the memory of Robert E. Seney, a 1944 graduate and later teacher at Baltimore City College. Awarded annually to the student who attains at least a 90 senior year grade point average, and who exhibits a high degree of development and use of the English language in all its forms, both written and oral.

Jamila Sia Daves

John F. Steadman Memorial Scholarship. Awarded for the first time to a member of the Class of 2002. Awarded to the senior who has achieved academically, especially in the junior and senior years. A student with demonstrated interest in Journalism, writing or some form of media will be strongly considered, as will those who have exhibited the ideals that constantly guided John F. Steadman, Class of 1945: the highest integrity and ethical standards, and a commitment to helping one's fellow man.

Cierra Larae Francis

Class of February, 1943 Scholarship. Established in 2001 by the surviving members of the Baltimore City College Class of February 1943. Awarded to the graduating senior who has excelled in epitomizing the levels of aspiration and achievement which are traditional at Baltimore City College.

Amanda Charlene Rogers

Baltimore City College Alumni Prize Scholarship. Endowed in 1995 to commemorate the founding of the Baltimore City College in 1839 and the support of their alma mater by its graduates since the founding of the Alumni Association in 1866. Awarded to the best member of the graduating senior class who has demonstrated superior academic ability, extraordinary service to the school and potential for significant achievement in an institution of higher learning.

Zachary Wiener

The Campbell Bernstein Slusky Scholarship. Established in 2005 by Neil R. Berstein, Class of 1954, in memory of Irene Campbell Bernstein, his mother, and Stanton H. Slusky, his cousin, Class of 1950. Awarded to the most diversely talented graduating senior who has achieved an academic rank in the top twenty percent of his or her class and earned a varsity athletic letter and participated for at least two years in a Baltimore City College instrumental or vocal music group.

Thomas Edward Dawson

Calvin E. Tyler, Jr. Scholarship. Established in 2005 by Calvin E. Tyler, Jr., Baltimore City College Class of 1960. Awarded annually to a graduating senior who is a resident of Baltimore and is deserving of financial assistance to attend an institution of higher learning.

Christina L. Craft

Dr. Stanley Kogan Scholarship. In recognition of a graduating student exhibiting high academic achievement and social awareness who is deemed in need of financial assistance.

Harold Greenwald Memorial Scholarship

Established in March 2006 by family and friends to honor the memory of Harold Greenwald, alumnus of the Class of 1928 and faculty member for 36 years. Awarded annually to the graduating senior who demonstrates intellectual curiosity and love of American History; has achieved academic excellence in the field and intends to pursue studies at an institution of higher learning.

Adam D. Stokes

Judge R.H. Hammerman Memorial Scholarship

Established in October 2006 by friends, Family and Lancers Club to honor the memory of Judge Robert I.H. Hammerman. Awarded annually to the graduating senior who will be attending the Johns Hopkins University and who has financial needs.

Lemuel C. and William M. Dunbar Scholarship

Established in 2007 by William M. Dunbar, Baltimore City College Class of 1949, in memory of his father, Lemuel C. Dunbar, Baltimore City College Class of 1923, and to commemorate the esteem which they shared for their alma mater. Awarded annually to a Baltimore City College graduating senior who has demonstrated service to the school by being elected class officer or student government officer.

Renovation of Alumni Field

Under the leadership of Jacob Howard the Baltimore City College Alumni Association is the process of raising 1.7 million dollars to renovate Alumni Field. The athletic Field, track, and stadium are in dire need of repair. The field has become a dust bowl with most of the grass worn away. Baltimore City College has not had a track meet at the school for the past five years. The plans include a new synthetic surface installed on the field, the track will be resurfaced, and new fence installed, new benches on the grandstand, lights installed, and a press box installed. This would give our scholar athletes the type of facility a safe and decent field to perform on.

Summer Bridge Program

Under the leadership of Jacob Howard the Alumni Association participated in the schools Summer Bridger Program. The Summer Bridge Program is an orientation program for the in coming freshman class. Nine members of the Alumni Association participated in the program. The Alumni Association sponsored the Scavenger Hunt. The Scavenger Hunt was a 80 question document that leads the students around the school to find certain destinations. This exercise will help the students find their way around the school. The Scavenger Hunt also gives a history lesson about the school. The Alumni Association gave out tee shirts during their part of the orientation program. This was a very successful program and the association will make this a annual part of their program to the school.

Summer Camp

The Alumni Association gave financial assistance to the Men's and Women's Basketball teams. This financial assistance allowed the teams to participate in summer leagues.
